8 Heritage Sites — Walking Order

- 1 Cheong Fatt Tze Mansion**
The iconic Blue Mansion — 19th-century indigo-blue Hakka heritage house. Guided tours daily.
- 2 Pinang Peranakan Mansion**
Six rooms of Peranakan antiques, opium beds, and Nyonya ceramics.
- 3 Penang Museum**
Colonial-era building tracing Penang's history from trading port to UNESCO city.
- 4 St George's Church**
Oldest Anglican church in Southeast Asia (1818). Neo-classical colonial architecture.
- 5 Kapitan Keling Mosque**
The largest mosque in Penang — Mughal-style with Indian Muslim heritage.
- 6 Khoo Kongsi Clan House**
The most elaborate clan house in Penang — ornate carvings, dragon sculptures, mini opera stage.
- 7 Clan Jetties**
Six waterfront Chinese clan villages on stilts — Chew Jetty is the most photographed.
- 8 Fort Cornwallis**
British colonial star-shaped fort (1786) — where Francis Light first landed. Free entry.

Walking Tips

- Start early (7–9am) — cooler and fewer crowds. Full walk takes 2.5–3 hours.
- Wear comfortable shoes — George Town streets are cobblestone.
- Most clan houses open 9am–5pm. Cheong Fatt Tze tours at 11am, 1:30pm, 3pm.
- Trishaw rides available near Fort Cornwallis (RM 30–50 for 30 mins).
